Region 6 Webinar on Compassion Fatigue and Burnout -- April 4, 2023

Compassion fatigue, also known as secondary trauma, is characterized by a gradual lessening of compassion and empathy over time. This can happen to caregivers when working with people who are suffering or that have been traumatized. Is there a balance that can be reached? There is much discussion of "self-care" but sometimes caregivers are not very good at it. Join this presentation and learn the protective factors along with the warnings that they may be burning out.
